Email Scam Warning

You may have read my recent Tech Safety Bulletin in E-News 83 (<https://www.generalconference.org.uk/wp-content/uploads/2021/02/Tech-Safety-Bulletin.pdf>) which discussed various things to be wary of online.

In the first tip I explained the two types of fake emails from friends/contacts: the first being rarer because the person has actually been hacked and had their emails taken over. Well a few instances of this have come to

my attention since then so I wanted to make you all aware.

I received an email today from an old contact with the title 'Favour' and asking if I had an Amazon account. The first thing I did was check the sender email address and it was in fact the contact's genuine email address. I know for a fact this person would not be emailing me asking for a favour so this means he has been hacked and a malicious third party is in charge of his emails. They will have emailed every person in his contacts list/address book asking for a favour, which if initially responded to, will escalate to asking for something financial.

So even if the email address is correct and you believe the message to be genuine, if a person is asking for anything financial at all, please phone them to confirm it is actually them before proceeding.
