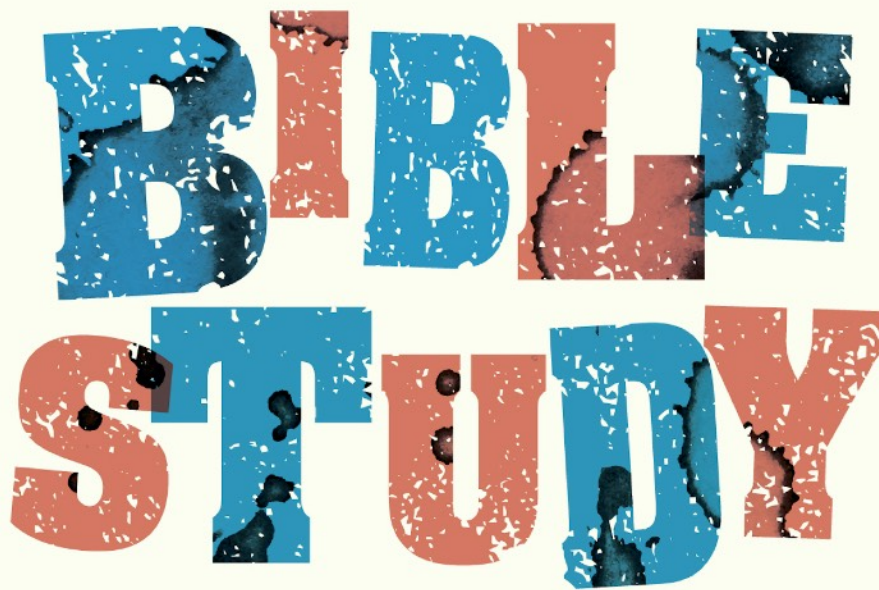
Dick came over to the UK with his wife, Gill, and their children in 1978 to undertake training for ordination, and was ordained in 1982 at Derby New

IT Safety Advice

Gemma McLean writes:



I wanted to remind IT users that downloading files that you aren't certain of (e.g. you aren't sure who the sender is or whether it's legitimate) is never a good idea.

Even files that might seem harmless like an Excel spreadsheet can actually have viruses embedded in them so it's important to be vigilant when downloading and running files.

Example: **.xll** files look a lot like regular **.xls** spreadsheet documents but are in fact powerful add-ons for Microsoft Excel that can be used to transfer viruses. For more advanced IT users, you may find this article interesting:

Also please remember that files that end with **.exe**, **.dll**, and **.rar** are all particularly dangerous and should only be downloaded if you are certain of the origin.
