Phone Scam Warning

Gemma McLean writes:

Please always be on the look out for scam phone calls as well as emails.

The latest one I have been alerted to is a scammer pretending to be from BT OpenReach. They will tell you that you need a new router and are due a refund for poor service, and need your payment details to process this.



They will also try and gain access to your computer and/or mobile phone by getting you to install special apps that let them access your devices.

The real BT OpenReach will never ask you for personal details over the phone and will never ask to take over your devices.

The same applies for any other callers asking for financial details or access to your devices over the phone. **Do not even engage with them.**

If you think it might be genuine then hang up the phone and make sure you get a proper dial tone to ensure they aren't still connected. Then, phone the company they claim to be calling from using their official phone number (find this online or on an official letterhead). If they are genuine, they'll have no problem with you doing this. If they aren't genuine, you have just saved yourself from being scammed.
